We have a revery excited to announce that the BODs of DAANA formally established an Endowment Fund in 2022. This fund will be managed by a separate and Independent Committee consisting of Alumni members in good standing. Although the concept of the fund was introduced by Dr Rafeuddin Azaz in 2019, after discussions, due diligence, bylaw revisions, attorney and CPA deliberations, it was eventually launched at the recent Florida Reunion in July 2022. We had a very positive response with more than \$130k collected so far and outstanding pledges for future projects. This is a wonderful achievement for an organization that has been in existence for less than 10 years. The goal of the fund is to invest ethically and use the returns for the humanitarian and charitable causes pursuant with DAANA's mission and charter. With consistent donations and growth, we anticipate a value of more than one million dollars in 5 years Inshallah.

DAAE is made of alumni from Deccan College of Medical Sciences (DCMS) in Hyderabad in India who are living in the UK and Europe. In the last update we have highlighted the aims and objectives of DAAE and also the vision statement.

The year 2022 brought a mixed bag of joy and jubilation among people that there was a relief from the Coronavirus to a great extent. But at the same time the year 2022 reminded us of our beloved, who were there with us a few years back but left this world due to the pandemic. This was a year of reflection and remembrance for all the humanity of how precious our lives are and how we should be taking care of ourselves. Here in the United Kingdom and other parts of Europe we have witnessed a large scale of lives being impacted due to Coronavirus which has not only resulted in a huge death toll, but also devastation caused in the lives of those who survived the virus resulting in long term conditions. The economic impact has been felt across in the community at all strata of social lives.

Despite this our Covid warriors in the NHS worked relentlessly to fight this disease, and this includes all our frontline DAAE members who were part of the teams across in the UK and Europe. Earlier in the year DAAE launched its first ever annual event in March 2022 which was attended by alumni and their families from across the UK, Ireland, US, Middle East and India. This event was marked by excellent presentations, children and teens programs, felicitation of the dignitaries, light entertainment and a delicious Hyderabadi style dinner to conclude the evening. The feast continued around in the UK with number of alumni organising mini reunions after the main event in the following weeks and months.

In my last update in the DAANA newsletter I have informed all of you about our newly formed board of directors (BOD) who have taken the office in September 2022. This brings new energy and enthusiasm to the planning and preparation that we have envisaged for the next few years. Our community work continues with the help and support of our sister organisations DAA, DAANA and DAAME. There have been online and face to face clinics, presentations, awareness programs and community work back home in India in collaboration with DAA, Hyderabad.

I would like to highlight some of the recent developments happening in the background:

a. DAAE Mentorship Scheme: In the recent months DAAE and its BOD has observed a significant influx of new doctors arriving in the UK for the purposes of relocation and better prospects. These new doctors have found our DAAE members very helpful and supportive in the initial days of their settlement. This support has been undoubtedly going on informally for the last many years but BOD has taken a decision in the last year to formally establish a 'mentoring group' with zealous and enthusiastic Consultants working in healthcare sector to come forward and mentor these new doctors for a period of time. This will not only include the initial help and support but will also include long term mentoring. For instance developing and building CVs, looking for Clinical Attachments, jobs in local organisations, 1:1 support with interviews and further assistance in future job / accommodation challenges.

b. Collaboration with other organisations: DAAE aims and aspires to fight for the injustice that happens in the name of religious, cultural and ethnic discrimination in various parts of the globe. A number of

organisations especially the ones working for the human rights and human justice had organised a campaign against Islamophobia in the UK for its 10 years of celebrations. IAM (Islamophobia Awareness Month) was founded in 2012 to create awareness about Islam and Muslims among communities and to tackle the Islamophobia in the society. DAAE has lend its support to this the IAM in November 2022. Similar collaborations are being made by the other organisations that work on the humanitarian principles.

c. CPD and themed sessions: One of the important areas of focus in DAAE is the continuing professional development. In this year and coming year DAAE will focus on running CPD sessions covering important areas of medicine. This will include invited sessions, presentations, workshops, from leading experts in their fields. These sessions will be open to all the doctors and healthcare professionals to enhance their learning and achieve CPD points. We will pursue to work with Royal Colleges in the UK to get approvals for our CPD sessions which is something that many people have valued in the past.






Telemedicine Clinic launched where specialists from abroad can offer expert second opinion on complex medical cases. Physicians involved in launch:


